Volunteer Issue

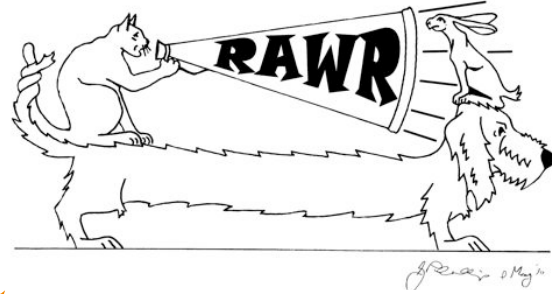
