Earlier this year, in the warmth of the June sunshine, RAWR volunteer Sandy answered a call from West Cork Animal Welfare Group to say a 2 day old kitten had been found on the street in Clonakilty next to his mum who had been run over. Sandy is an experienced fosterer of kittens as well as an intrepid trapper of feral cats in our Trap Neuter and Return work. Knowing she had kitten formula etc and couldn't say no, they asked if she would foster him and so Malcolm was brought to his foster home.

He was tiny and vulnerable, with eyes and ears tightly closed, in need of love, warmth and.... Feeding!



For the next five weeks he was fed round the clock every three hours. After each feed his bottom was gently rubbed with cotton wool to simulate the mother's licking and encourage him to toilet.



Armed with a "baby bag" Sandy took him everywhere she went: Cork, Inchydonny, shopping and restaurants.

After the 5 weeks of sleepless nights and busy days bottle feeding, he was ready to be weaned and experience the freedom of the house, find his paws and learn to play he was let loose on the other, poor, unsuspecting resident pets. Well, very soon he could clear a room in 10 minutes and nobody was safe from his endless Ninja style attacks!

Thankfully all survived the onslaught and Malcolm has grown into a beautiful, very confident boy who went to his forever home on Saturday.




He has settled in very well and although he left his human and animal fosterers missing his dynamic furry presence, there were a few small sighs of relief as peace was restored to the household.
